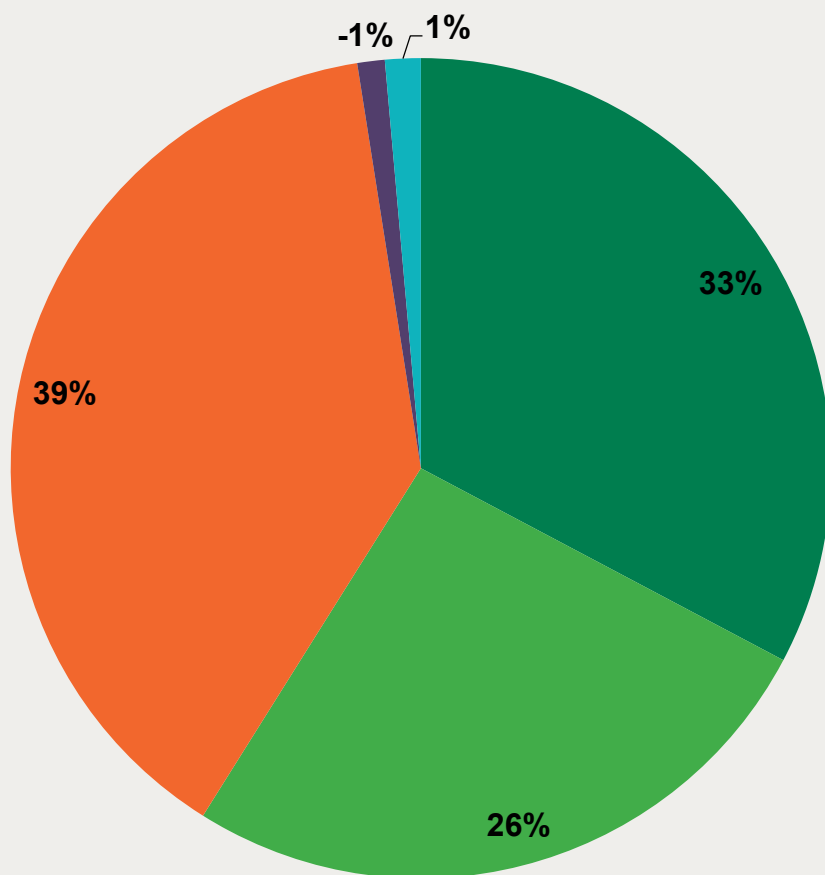

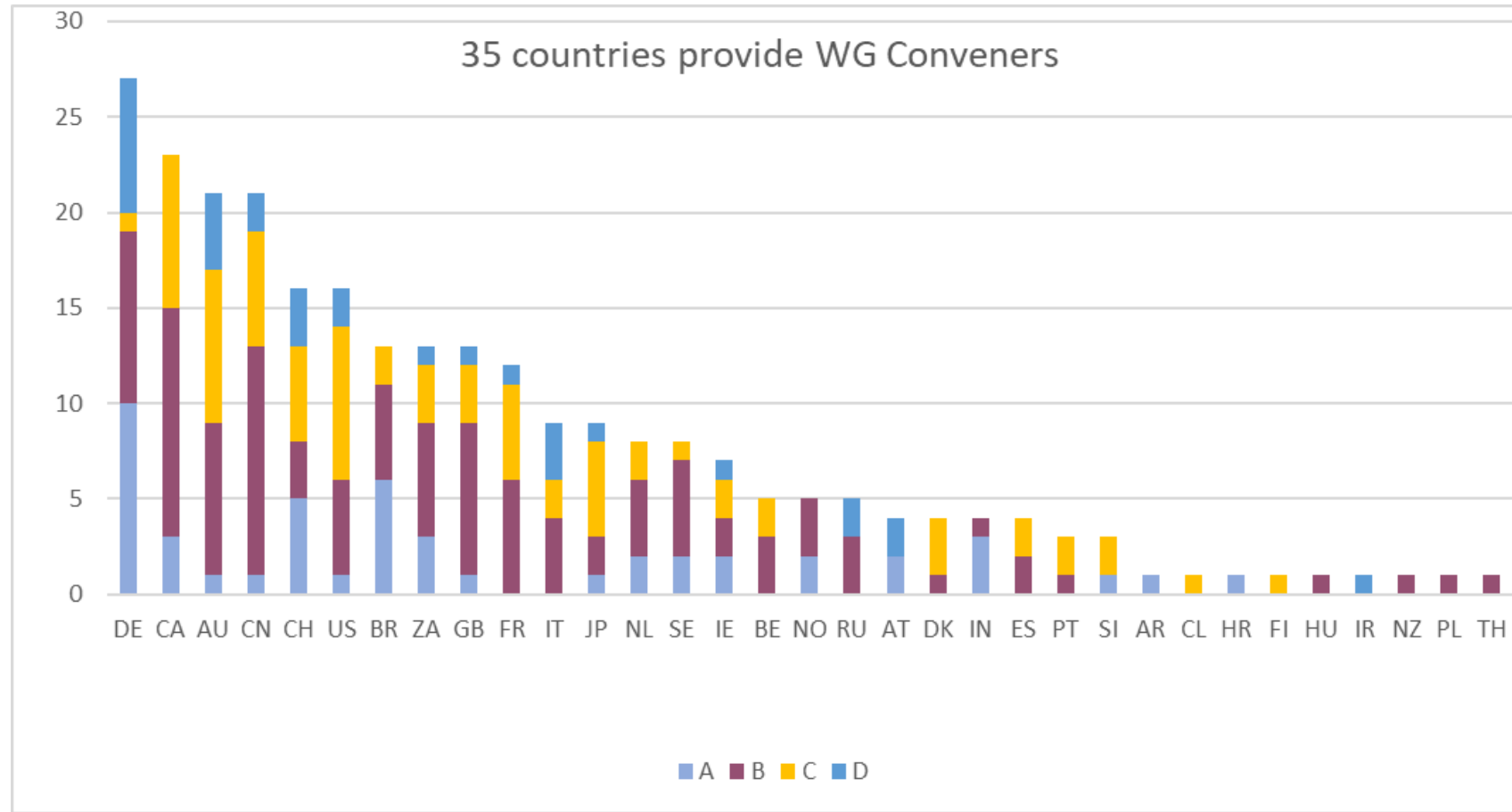
Working Groups/Task Forces Member Selection Process

- If more candidates are interested in same WG than CIGRE policy allows, set up a "Shadow WG" within the USNC

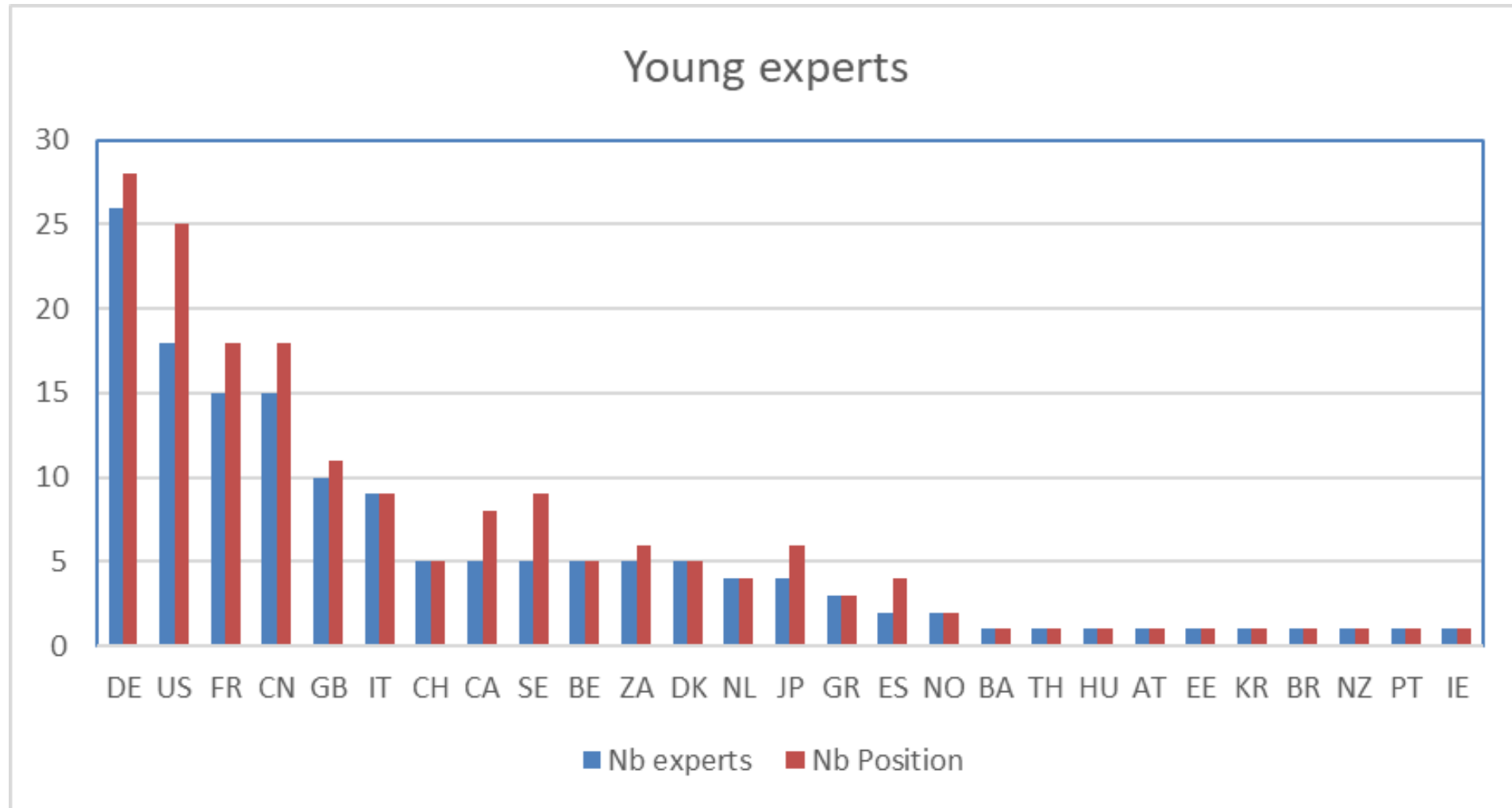
Number of experts / positions per Country



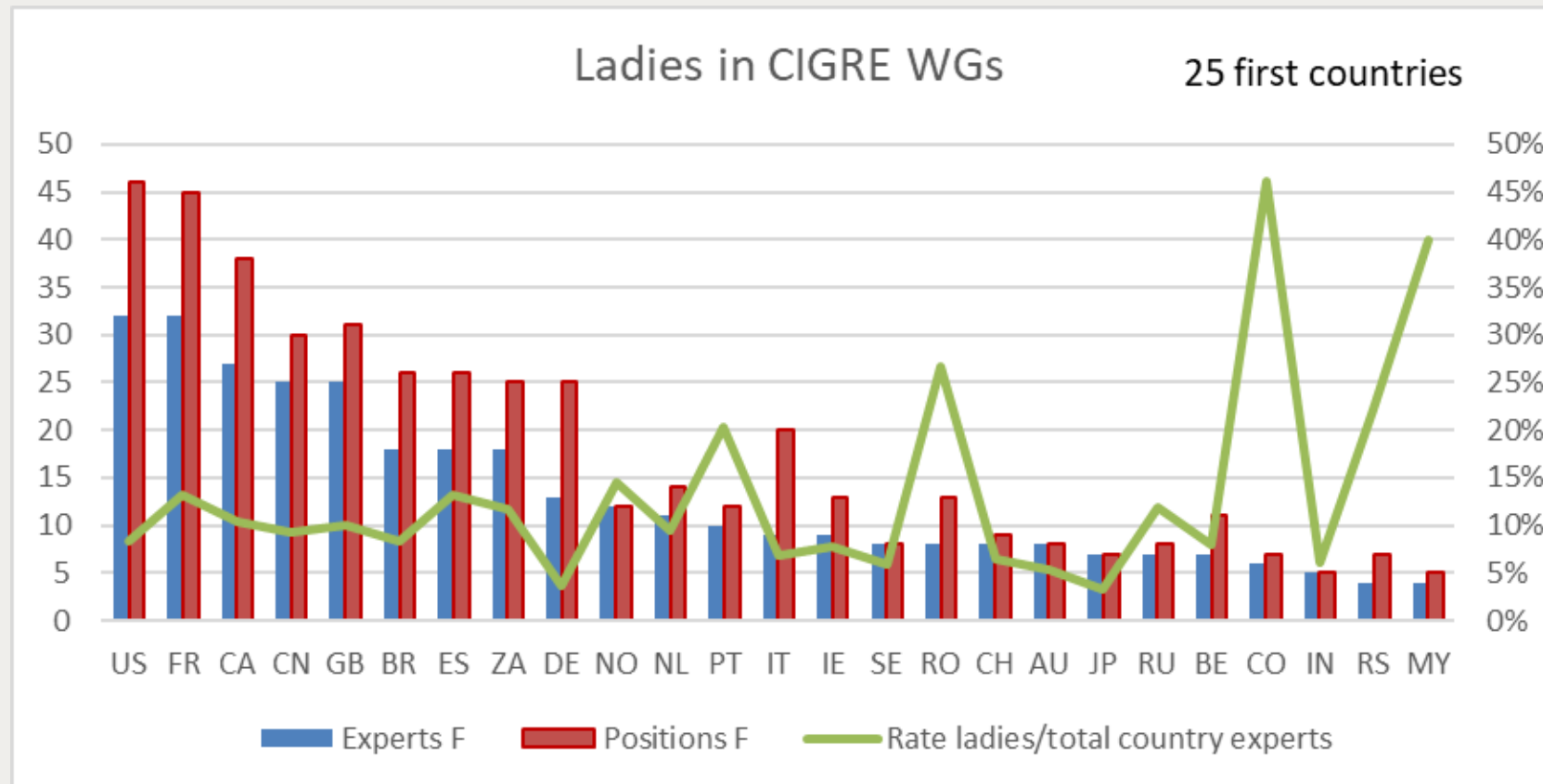
Country of the conveners



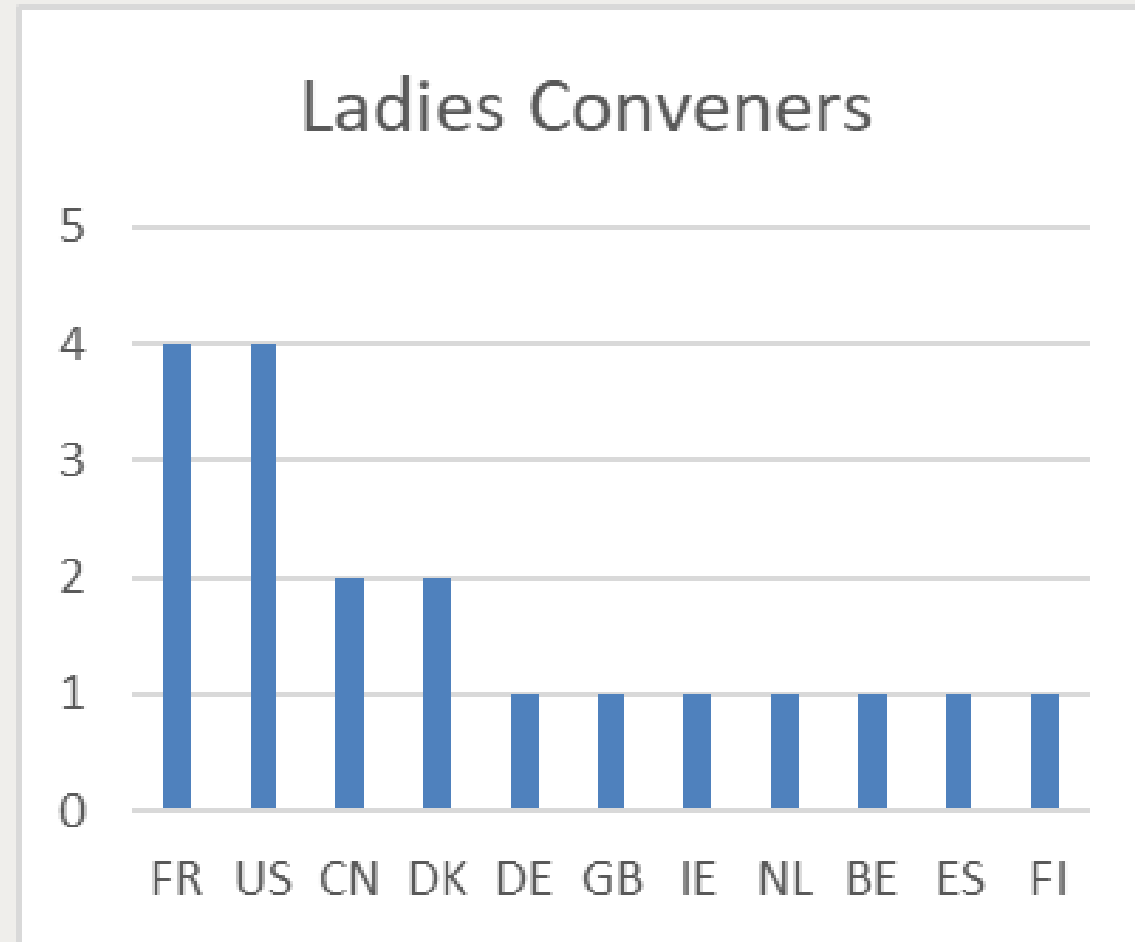
Number of Young Experts per Country
